

**We have teamed up with the *BNF* to produce a new e-learning programme, which will be released every six months as a new edition of the *BNF* is published.**

Pharmacy professionals working in community pharmacy and other primary care settings are now able to learn about significant changes to the *British National Formulary (BNF)* more easily with a new e-learning programme. A collaborative development between CPPE and the *BNF*, this e-learning tool will be released every six months, as each new edition of the *BNF* is published

The *BNF Update* e-learning programme will give pharmacists and pharmacy technicians the ability to identify and assess quickly how significant changes to the *BNF* affect their clinical practice.

#### **Who is it for?**

This e-learning programme is available on our website **FREE** to registered pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and pre-registration pharmacists in England.


#### **About the programme**

Each new version of this programme will include ten clinical case studies with short answer questions. The printed copy of the *BNF* or hyperlinks to relevant sections of the *online BNF* can be used to help answer the questions, which can be checked against the model version provided.

It will take about 30 to 60 minutes to complete.
